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> I just spoke to Jim Bean and he indicated that he had a good  
> conversation with Jake last week. Jim did some investigation regarding  
> Brown Road. We do know that is town-owned spanning 50 feet. What we do  
> not know is if it is in the middle of the 50 feet. It would be helpful  
> if Mr. Steinman could provide a survey of his property, which would  
> help in determining the boundaries of the road. Jim also feels that  
> the town should do the maintenance if any fill is being proposed and  
> which would require a wetlands permit. At this point the water access  
> could be blocked by boulders but the side of the road should not be blocked.
